Mary, Ken's sister, sent us the following obituary:

Ken Remington, age 75, passed away on Monday, December 1, 2025 after a short but ferocious battle with liver cancer. He was in Arkansas from his home in Panama.

Ken was born on January 22, 1950, 3 minutes older than his twin Mary Lee, the 4th and 5th children of Leo and Ruby Remington.

Ken is survived by his wife Vielka Remington, Orion (Emily) Remington, Brianna (Rob) Carlson, grandchildren Tyler Remington, Gabriel, William, Lukas, and Nicholas Carlson, sister Mary Lee Fortin, plus many nieces and nephews.

Ken began his career in nursing and transitioned that into nurse anesthetist in both the Army and Air Force, from which he retired as a Lt. Colonel. He saw service in Dessert Storm. He continued as a CRNA until retirement, when he and Vielka returned to life in Panama. He will be interred in the military cemetery in Panama City.

Ken was a unique man. He was quick to call you friend, slow to anger, and always had a story to tell. He will be missed by many. Fair winds and following seas Ken.
